



15 minute classroom art project prior to the [Waterology](#) assembly

Project Summary

- Your students will be better engaged in the upcoming live assembly by participating in this short project.
- From the vocabulary list below on page two, teacher may simply choose a word or phrase for their students to illustrate.
- For example, one student may illustrate part of the water cycle (if age appropriate) and another may illustrate sprinklers watering a lawn.
- Teacher selects a simple word or phrase for each student to illustrate.
- Mail the art to Shows That Teach and you are done! If requested by your assembly coordinator, Shows That Teach will even send a large pre-addressed envelope for your school to use.
- Shows That Teach will scan some or all of the art when it is received.

Students Benefit

- Students will better grasp science and conservation concepts through their involvement in this art project.
- Students will also be thrilled to see their own art displayed on a large screen during the assembly performance.

Details

1. Ask your students to have fun illustrating a word or phrase listed below. It is okay to assign different words to different students.
2. Each student creates his or her art on a single sheet of paper. 8-1/2 x 11" horizontal orientation please.
3. Any two dimensional medium (paint, crayon, etc.) is okay.
4. If necessary, show your students a photo of the object (perhaps from the Internet) if you believe they need to see what it looks like.
5. If you can not spare 15 min. of class time, students may do this project at home.
